March - La Crosse Area Homebuilders Association Home Show

With the help of 10 volunteers we set up an unconventional booth at the Omni Center in Onalaska. We brought a homey set-up with us including a dining room table, area rug, comfy chairs and props such as cleaning supplies, kitchen utensils and other high need items. This visual drew a lot of attention and we were able to



connect one-onone with a couple hundred potential donors. Five months later we continue to reap the benefits of participating, and I truly look forward to this event next spring!

NOTE FROM OUR BOARD PRESIDENT

he last couple of months have brought big changes and advancement to Shelter Development, Inc. and the Exchange. Shelter Development secured a sizable grant from the City of LaCrosse as the administrator of the American Rescue Plan Act funds. With that money Shelter Development made a large down payment and secured a mortgage on the building that houses the Exchange. The mortgage is much, much more affordable than the rent payment, allowing us to do other things with some of the funds donated to the operation of the Exchange.

the Exchange has grown enough to be supported by two staff people. Sarah, as Program Director, and Miranda, as part-time Operations Manager, make a great team and will provide stability and direction to volunteers, donors, partner agencies and recipients going forward. Obviously having a couple talented people on staff is a huge benefit, but without volunteers, we simply wouldn't exist. I'm looking forward to witnessing the expanded impact that the Exchange will have in the community as time goes on. Thank you all for your support!
