At the Exchange we have a fun, dedicated and lighthearted group of volunteers committed to helping our community! We provide household goods and gently used furniture effectively re-homing donated items to those in need. At this time, we are serving 10 households per week! The families and individuals we serve have a wide variety of stories of being unhoused—everything from fleeing domestic violence, job insecurities, house fires, medical hardships, and more.

In most cases, delivery of our clients' selections is necessary, and we have an incredible "delivery team" who consistently provide this beautiful service for our community and neighbors. But we are in desperate need of more volunteers who are able to help deliver the furniture to our clients within the city of La Crosse, La Crescent and Onalaska. We are also looking for people who have a vehicle to pull a trailer, or experience pulling a trailer.

Currently, this amazing team of movers goes out on Tuesday and Thursday mornings between 8:00-10:30. However, if you are not able to meet at those times and have a heart for this, please reach out and we can discuss other options.

In practice, Shelter Development, Inc. is comprised of the services provided at the Exchange as well as the Francis Homes program.

Francis Homes seeks to connect families experiencing homelessness, or at risk of homelessness, with affordable safe housing. Francis Homes works collaboratively with partner nonprofit organizations to provide case management support as a family moves from crisis to stability.

Moving forward you will find me at the Exchange supporting the work of our staff and volunteers, working with community partners and addressing administrative needs in support of the smooth operations of our programming.

Over 10 Household Appointments a Week Things move in and out fast!

W e continue to serve 10+ households a week!!! As a result, our inventory changes day to day. We are looking to replenish items large and small. Every little bit makes a long and lasting imprint! Thank you for your continued support!

Most In-Demand items

We always need kitchen tables (for family dinner), recliners, couches, storage units (side tables, dressers, shelving, etc), and rugs (large and small).

Can openers, hand and bath towels, laundry baskets and kitchen garbage cans are always out of stock.

Calling All Thrifty Shoppers

There are a handful of items that we purchase for clients such as dish soap, hand soap, all-purpose cleaners, shower curtain liners, brooms and toilet bowl cleaners. These aren't items that can be recycled or rehomed. We have a special fund set aside from your contributions to purchase these items. We are 501c3 - tax exempt and look to purchase items in bulk.

There was a group of 4th graders that collected spare change at Sunday School. Within a month they accumulated almost \$500! With their donation we went to the Dollar Tree and purchased two cases (96 count) of each of these items.


